Course description

The Master in Accounting and Finance prepares you for a career as a business manager, consultant, financial specialist, accountant and auditor.

Our programme will enable you to navigate the **digital transformation of companies and financial markets**. You will acquire the skills to become a successful player in the world of finance. The study programme provides technical knowledge in: financial reporting and control management, financial risk management and optimisation of investment portfolios, management of corporate risks and operational and financial restructuring. This knowledge ensures understanding of corporate dynamics and interpretation of its transformations.

Structure of the course

The courses offered include disciplines from the fields of accounting, finance, law, management, economics. Students can choose among three study tracks.

The curriculum has a **practice-oriented approach** that exposes students to best practices of management through case-based teaching, small-scale laboratories, presentations by guest speakers and simulations of professional tasks of various complexity. The teaching material is developed **in cooperation with professionals**, as well as with **financial organizations** or **consulting firms**.

Double Degree Programmes

We have a Double Degree programme in collaboration with a **prestigious university** in the United States, Baruch College. The Double Degree is aimed at a **small group of students** with **excellent academic achievement** in the first year and good knowledge of languages. Admitted students can attend the **Master of Science in Finance** or the **Master of Science in Accountancy** at Baruch College, City University of New York. At the end of the programme, students obtain both the master's degree (laurea magistrale) awarded by unibz and the corresponding "graduate" degree awarded by Baruch College.

At present, scholarships are available for this programme. One of them is funded by the Südtiroler Sparkasse AG, one by the Südtiroler Volksbank AG and one by Bureau Plattner.

Exchange programmes and internships

The master programme offers exchange programmes with **many European universities**. During the two years of this course, students are required to take an **internship** - of at least 150 hours - in a local, national or international firm in different sectors (manufacturing, professional services, financial industry) or in a non-profit institution.

International Certifications

The master programme is accredited by prestigious associations that issue international professional certificates in the accounting and financial field. The accreditation certifies the excellence of the quality standards of the programme and its high orientation towards professional practice. The master programme offers students the opportunity to attend courses in preparation for obtaining the following professional certificates:

- Chartered Alternative Investment Analyst (CAIA) - with the Chartered Alternative Investment Analyst Association
- Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA) – with the Chartered Financial Analyst Institute
- Financial Risk Manager (FRM) – with the Global Association of Risk Professionals (GARP)
- Certified Management Accountant (CMA) – with the Institute of Management Accounting (IMA)

Interested students will have to take the certification exam provided by the respective association. Reductions in the registration fee for these exams are provided for.

Awards (premi di laurea)

The best graduate of each track of the master programme will be awarded the equivalent of **one-year fee of € 1350**. Students' ranking will be determined on the average exams grade. The award ceremony takes place during the Degree Ceremony.

Sponsors are Bureau Plattner (for the track: Professional Accounting and Auditing), Südtiroler Sparkasse AG (for the track: Finance and Financial Markets), Rödl & Partner (for the track: Business administration and Consulting).

Career opportunities

Our graduates aim at the following professional careers:

- **Company Manager:** junior positions in planning and management control functions, auditing, administrative and accounting management in companies and institutions.
- **Business Consultant:** Junior business analyst positions.
- **Financial specialist:** junior positions of financial analyst, financial portfolio manager, specialist in the selection of real and financial investments, specialist in financial risk management with banks, insurance companies, rating agencies, asset and savings management companies, investment funds, funds and companies specialising in private equity, venture capital, alternative and sovereign investment funds.
- **Financial Manager:** junior positions in the functions of corporate treasury, corporate risk management and financial management of companies and financial intermediaries.
- **Chartered Accountant and Auditor:** an agreement with the Association of Chartered Accountants and Auditors of the Autonomous Province of Bozen-Bolzano facilitates the

entry of students enrolled in this master programme in Section A of the Register of Chartered Accountants and Auditors, as explained in this video.

This study programme also provides access to post-graduate training, such as a PhD programme.

The programme will only be offered if a minimum of 15 newly enrolled students is reached.

Entry requirements

In order to gain admission to this programme you need one of the following qualifications:

1. a bachelor degree (*) in one of the following Italian degree classes or an equivalent qualification gained abroad:

- D. 270/04:
L-18 Economics and Business Administration
L-33 Economics
- D. 509/99:
17 Economics and Business Administration
28 Economic Sciences
- Final degree or university certificate from a School of Economics, according to the regulation in force before M.D. 509/99.

(*) Italian citizen who have obtained their degree abroad must also have a secondary school leaving qualification.

or

2. a bachelor degree in a different class to the ones listed above or an equivalent qualification gained abroad. **At least 15 credit points** must have been acquired in one or more of the following scientific-disciplinary sectors:

- SECS-P/07 - Accounting
- SECS-P/08 - Business Administration
- SECS-P/09 - Managerial Finance
- SECS-P/11 - Economics and Management of Financial Intermediary
- ING-IND/35 - Industrial Engineering

If you apply during the second session and do not reach the needed CPs in time, you can enrol to unibz as external student and sit the following exams:

- 27320 Accounting (prer. LM77AF) - 8 CPs SECS-P/07
- 27321 Finance (prer. LM77AF) - 7 CPs SECS-P/09

The cost of the enrolment is € 200 for each single exam.

You can enrol through the following link: <https://www.unibz.it/it/applicants/single-subject-courses/> and hand in the requested documents at the Student Secretariat. You will get an account in order to be able to enrol by yourself to the mentioned exams online within the deadline of 20 June 2020. The exams are scheduled to take place on 26 June 2020.

In order to obtain the texts needed for the preparation for the exams, please contact the Faculty Secretariat (elena.borile@unibz.it).

You need to upload the self-declaration about the passed exams in the application portal by the application deadline (see section "Online Application").

If you have not yet graduated at the time of application:

You can apply if you have acquired at least 140 credit points (ECTS). In this case you will be admitted conditionally, and you need to submit your diploma by the enrolment deadline.

If you graduate after the enrolment deadline:

You cannot enrol and you will lose your place, which will be offered to the subsequent applicant in the ranking list. In this case you should not pay the tuition fees to secure your admission. You will be able to submit a late enrolment request and, only if there still are available places, you can enrol by 18 December 2020.

To be admitted, you must fulfil the language requirements indicated in the section "Language requirements".

Concurrent enrolment at several universities or in several study programmes at the same university is not allowed.

Language requirements

The official teaching languages are German, Italian and English. Therefore, the following language requirements apply, otherwise you will be excluded from the admission procedure:

Entry level (to gain admission)

1st language: C1

2nd language: B2

3rd language: no level required

Exit level (to graduate)

1st language: C1

2nd language: C1

3rd language: B1

The levels of the Common European Framework of Reference apply.

Your first language is the language in which you have the highest level of proficiency (C1). Your third language is instead the language in which you are weaker (or in which you are an absolute beginner).

You can demonstrate your language proficiency in the application portal (in the section “upload language certificates” and/or “enrol for language exams”) after you have created an application in the section “create/manage applications”. The certification is mandatory for the first and second language, for the third language it is recommended (from B1 onwards).

- In case your final certificate has been awarded by an **Italian** public institution, you need to submit a self-declaration.
- In case your final certificate has been awarded by a **foreign** public institution, you need to upload diploma scanned copy of the original.

You can demonstrate language proficiency through:

1. **the main teaching language in your final high school year** if German, Italian or English (recognised as C1) (Latin upper secondary schools: recognised as B2 in German and Italian).
2. **a bachelor or master degree** in Italian, German or English (recognised as C1). unibz graduates must upload the language certificates obtained and/or declare that they have passed language exams at the unibz Language Centre (B2, B2+ or C1)
3. **a recognised language certificate** (see the list of recognised certificates: <https://www.unibz.it/en/services/language-centre/study-in-three-languages/>) If you cannot upload the certificates, you can send them by e-mail as PDF files or deliver them in person to the Language Centre by the application deadline (see “Deadlines” section).
4. **language exams organised by the unibz Language Centre**. You can register for these exams online through the application portal (in the section “enrol for language exams”) after you have filled out your application in the section “create/manage applications”. The registration periods are indicated in the “Deadlines” section. If you start your application outside a language exams registration period, you must return to the portal during one of the periods indicated above in order to register for an exam.

Secondary schools in a foreign country/Bi- or multilingual schools

If the foreign language proficiency levels (for German, Italian, or English) are explicitly indicated on the diploma of graduation according to the Common European Framework of Reference (i.e., B1, B2 or C1), and if all four language abilities (reading, listening, speaking, writing) have been assessed, then the indicated levels will be accepted as a proof of proficiency for the second and/or third language.

Please upload your school-leaving certificate to the application portal in the section “upload language certificates” under the respective language. The Language Centre will decide on its recognition.

Third language/Intensive language courses in September

If you have already acquired a language certificate in the third teaching language, please upload it to the portal. If you are not able to certify your language competence in the third language and you are admitted to unibz, you will have to take a placement test. You will receive further information about the test by e-mail. Based on the result of the placement test, you will be assigned to a certain learning path so that you will be able to reach level B1 as soon as possible.

If you are an absolute beginner in the third language, or if you have a level below B1, you may attend a three-week intensive language course during the pre-semester session in September in order to start the learning path.

The dates of the extensive courses are indicated in the “Deadlines” section. Beginner courses (A1) will be offered exclusively during the pre-semester intensive course session in September will no longer be offered during the academic year. Therefore, absolute beginners should start their learning path for the third language by attending the intensive courses in September.

There will be extensive courses (4 hours per week) during the semesters and intensive courses (8 hours per week) during the time between semesters.

The language courses offered by the Language Centre are **free of charge** and aim to help the students reach the level B1 in the third language after the first study year.

Online Application

Your application must be submitted online through the Application Portal. The deadlines are indicated in the “Deadlines” section.

- You need to create an account;
- Then fill in the form online and check if the required information is complete;
- Upload the required attachments for every selected study programme in the portal and submit the application by the deadline. Once the application has been sent, it cannot be modified. Filled-in forms which have not been sent correctly will not be taken into consideration.

Please note: Mendacious declarations will be criminally prosecuted and will result in the automatic exclusion from the ranking list.

You have to upload:

- a passport-size colour photo;
- a photocopy of a valid identity card or passport (front/back). Please note: if your document is invalid, incomplete or unreadable, you will be excluded from the admission procedure;
- the attachments listed under “Admission procedure”.

If you gained your qualification abroad, you must also upload:

- the diploma of your qualification: if you are not yet in possession of the diploma, you can upload it upon enrolment at the very latest - until you have not uploaded your diploma, you can only gain conditional admission;
- an official translation of the qualification into Italian (not necessary for qualifications in German or English);

- the Diploma supplement, where it must be indicated: that the student has achieved at least 180 credit points (ECTS) and that the study title gives access to a master programme.

In case of doubt, unibz reserves the right to request further documents (e.g. declaration of equivalent value).

- the declaration of equivalent value of your qualification: if you are not yet in possession of the declaration, you can upload it upon enrolment at the very latest (see next paragraph);
- the valid permit to stay for Italy (only for non-EU citizens legally resident in Italy) - see below chapter "EU-citizens and equivalent" point 2.

The declaration of equivalent value (not necessary for qualifications gained in Austria or Germany, but unibz reserves the right to request it in case of doubt)

If you have a foreign qualification, you must certify that your qualification would grant you admission to a similar study programme in the country where you gained this qualification. For this reason, you must:

- apply for the "dichiarazione di valore" (declaration of equivalent value) at an Italian consulate or embassy abroad (please apply for the declaration as soon as possible since processing times might be long);
- upload the declaration upon enrolment at the very latest, together with the other relevant documents.

EU-Citizens and equivalent

You might apply for more than one study programme. If you are excluded in the first session, you might apply again in the second one.

Considered as equivalent are:

1. Citizens from Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Switzerland, San Marino and the Vatican City State;
2. Non-EU citizens with a valid permit to stay in Italy (see article 39, paragraph 5 of decree no. 286 of 25.07.1998: "**permesso di soggiorno**" (residence permit) for work, family reasons, political or humanitarian asylum, religious reasons). In this case, you apply directly to the University as described above and must submit a copy of your valid permit to stay. A permit to stay for study reasons or a visa for tourism is **not**. If the permit has expired, you must attach a renewal request. **Please note** that if you do not provide the permit, you will be automatically considered a non-EU citizen living abroad and therefore subject to the admission procedure through the Italian authorities in your country of origin.

Non-EU-Citizens (living outside of Italy)

Only one application period is offered. After the deadline it is not possible to apply anymore. Application fee: € 30.

As a non-EU citizen living abroad, you will also have to **apply at the Italian authorities** (consulate or embassy) in your country. The deadlines set by the Italian Ministry of Education, Universities and Research (<http://www.studiare-in-italia.it/studentistranieri/>) must be met. At the Italian authorities, you can apply for one study programme only. Should you not

follow this procedure with the local Italian authorities, your direct online application to unibz will be declared null and void.

Admission procedure

The admission procedure is based on the following criteria:

1. Applicants

with a bachelor (“laurea”) in the scientific class L-18 or L-33 or LM 77 (M.D. 270/04) or any equivalent Italian degree of previous systems or any equivalent foreign degree or applicants with a bachelor in another scientific class who have more than 25 ECTS credit points* in one or more of the following scientific-disciplinary sectors:

- SECS-P/07 - Accounting
- SECS-P/08 - Business Administration
- SECS-P/09 - Managerial Finance
- SECS-P/11 - Economics and Management of Financial Intermediary
- ING-IND/35 - Industrial Engineering

a. Grade average (max. 95 points).

- If you have already graduated: Final mark
- If you have not graduated yet: The grade average of the passed university exams

In the case of a bachelor degree concluded with the highest mark and the mention “summa cum laude”, 2 additional points will be awarded.

b. Knowledge of the three official teaching languages on a higher level than required for admission (C1, B2) (max. 5 points).

For details please see the paragraph “Language requirements for admission”.

c. Up to a maximum of 5 points can be recognised if you have passed exams in one or more courses in your previous study career that are equivalent to courses in the study plan of the Master in Accounting and Finance.

d. Minimum of points to reach in order to be admitted to the ranking: min. 63 points

In the event of a score parity, candidates with GMAT or GRE will have priority. In the event of a further score parity, the general criteria set out below will be applied. (**, ***)

2. Applicants

with a bachelor in another scientific class who have from 15 to 25 credit points* in one or more of the following scientific-disciplinary sectors:

- SECS-P/07 - Accounting
- SECS-P/08 - Business Administration
- SECS-P/09 - Managerial Finance
- SECS-P/11 - Economics and Management of Financial Intermediary
- ING-IND/35 - Industrial Engineering

a. Grade average (max. 55 points).

- If you have already graduated: Final grade
- If you have not graduated yet: The grade average of the passed university exams

In the case of a bachelor concluded with the highest grade and the mention “summa cum laude”, 2 additional points will be awarded.

b. GMAT-Test or GRE*** or Skype interview for candidates that do not have a GMAT-Test or GRE (max. 40 points).**

c. Knowledge of the three official teaching languages on a higher level than required for the admission (C1, B2) (max. 5 points).

For details please see the paragraph “Language requirements for admission”.

d. Up to a maximum of 5 points can be recognised if you have passed exams in one or more courses in your previous study career that are equivalent to courses in the study plan of the Master in Accounting and Finance.

e. Minimum of points to reach in order to be admitted to the ranking: min. 63 points

*Courses included in the programme of the Master in Accounting and Finance are not valid for the acquisition of the required ECTS credit points.

Courses that have been taken into consideration in order to achieve the ECTS credit points necessary to gain admission to the master cannot be recognised for a possible career abbreviation.

**The GMAT-Test is considered only in case it has been passed with more than 490 points and in the last 5 years before the admission procedure. It is part of the sum leading to the final mark but is in no way a mandatory prerequisite for the admission to the master.

The commission will take into consideration also potential unofficial GMAT score reports, but the candidates will have to hand in the official report no later than the deadline for the payment of the first instalment.

***The GRE-Test is considered as alternative to the GMAT-test only in case it has been passed with more than 300 points and in the last 5 years before the admission procedure. It is part of the sum leading to the final grade but is in no way a mandatory prerequisite for the admission to the master.

Only applications containing all requested documents will be evaluated. If one of the documents requested for the grade average criteria is missing, the candidate will not be considered.

In the event of equal scores, priority will be given to the applicant who has obtained the highest score for the grade average. If scores are still equal, the younger applicant will have priority.

If you still need to graduate and/or certify the remaining exams you must sit, you are

provisionally admitted.

In the application portal, you shall upload:

a. Study title

- **if graduated in Italy:** diploma supplement or self-declaration (following the Italian D.P.R. no. 445/2000) of the degree awarded with the exams passed (if graduated) or with the exams passed (if not graduated yet);
- **if graduated abroad:** diploma supplement or final degree certificate with exams passed (if graduated) or transcript of records (if not graduated yet) in Italian, German or English.

The above must contain the following information: final grade, exams passed with grade and date of passing, credit points, scientific fields (the latter only for Italian titles).

For qualifications obtained abroad also: scale of grades awarded by the university of provenance (with a minimum final grade to obtain the qualification and a maximum final grade achievable).

The Faculty reserves the right to request a description of the contents of the single courses and/or teaching hours where necessary.

b. Excel file: If you have not graduated yet, you must confirm that you have acquired at least 140 ECTS credit points in your previous study programme. Please use the excel file available in the application portal.

c. GMAT-Test or GRE

Please note: mendacious declarations will be sanctioned by criminal law and will result in your automatic exclusion.

Ranking lists

The Admission Committee will only evaluate the documents uploaded in the portal by the application deadline. The ranking lists with the admitted students will be published here and are only valid for the respective academic year.

Secure your admission and enrolment

If you have been admitted to more than one study programme, you can only secure your admission in one of them. Doing so you refrain from the admission to other programmes.

1. Choose the study programme and pay the fees (to secure your admission) in the application portal.

The deadlines are indicated in the “Deadlines” section.

If you do not meet this deadline, you will automatically be excluded and the next applicant in the ranking list will be admitted.

For EU citizens and citizens given parity of treatment only: any remaining places of the early bird application, will be offered in the late application.

Please note that you do not gain full student status by only paying the tuition fees. This status will only be acquired upon enrolment. If you have secured your admission, there will be no

refund of the tuition fees unless you do not pass your secondary school final exam or, in the event of non-EU applicants living abroad, you do not receive the documents necessary for enrolment from the Italian authorities in your country.

2. Enrol online in the application portal.

The deadlines are indicated in the “Deadlines” section.

Enrolment is recommended as early as possible, so you have the possibility to upload incomplete documents before the deadline.

If you do not meet the enrolment deadline, you will be excluded and the next applicant in the ranking list will be admitted.

Admission with reservation:

If you do not have the required academic qualification, you will be given a conditional offer for a study place and you must submit your qualification upon enrolment. If you achieve your qualification after the enrolment deadline, you cannot enrol, and you will lose your place which will be offered to the subsequent applicant in the ranking list. **Advice:** If you achieve your qualification after the enrolment deadline, you should not pay the tuition fees to confirm the study place. You will be able to submit a late enrolment request and, only if there are study places still available, you can enrol by 18 December 2020.

If you have gained your qualification abroad, you must upload (if not uploaded upon application):

- diploma of your qualification
- official translation of your diploma into Italian (translation is not necessary if it has been issued in German or English)
- the Diploma supplement, where it must be indicated: that you have achieved at least 180 credit points (ECTS) and that the study title gives access to a Master course. In case of doubt, unibz reserves the right to request further documents (e.g. declaration of equivalent value).
- the declaration of equivalent value of your qualification, in the case the Diploma supplement is missing.

At the beginning of the academic year you must submit **the originals** of the above-mentioned documents to the Student Secretariat.

Please note that if you do not possess a valid admission qualification, you could be excluded with Rector’s decree even after enrolment.

If you are a non-EU citizen living abroad:

If you are eligible for admission (check the ranking lists), the Italian Authorities in your own country will issue you the entry visa for studies/university.

This will allow you to arrive in Italy to enrol for the study programme that you have applied for, after passing the admission procedure.

According to Italian law, within 8 working days of your arrival in Italy, you must have applied for the residence permit: as soon as you arrive, get in touch with the Advisory Service and you will be given the necessary information for starting the procedure.

Once you will obtain your residence permit (permesso di soggiorno), you have to hand it in at the Student Secretariat personally or via e-mail.

Students intending to transfer from another Italian University to unibz must submit to the Student Secretariat - at the beginning of the academic year - a copy of the transfer application presented at the university of provenance.

Tuition Fees

Fees amount to **€ 1348.50**.

- **1st instalment (€ 748.50)***: includes the provincial tax for the right to study of € 148.50 and a revenue stamp of € 16.
- **2nd instalment (€ 600)**: must be paid by 31 March 2021.

Delayed payment of the second instalment will result in a fine being levied. If you have not paid the tuition fees, you will be unable to take exams and will not be able to transfer to other universities or other study programmes.

If you drop out of a programme, interrupt your studies or are excluded from studies, you are not entitled to reimbursement of the fees.

Exemption from the tuition fees (and the provincial tax) is granted to:

- Students with a disability recognized under article 3, paragraph 1, of Law No 104/1992, or with a disability up to or exceeding 66%: the disability certificate, issued by the health authorities, must be handed in at the beginning of the academic year.
- Foreign students who have been granted a scholarship from the Italian government.

Students who benefit from a scholarship granted by the Autonomous Province of Bozen-Bolzano are entitled to receive a refund of the tuition fees.

Recognition of credit points from previous studies

Credit points from previous university studies can only be recognised after enrolment if the exams taken at the university of provenance are equivalent in content to those offered at unibz. You can fill out the application after enrolment at your Faculty Secretariat.

The Advisory Service provides support regarding your choice of study. In many cases a simple call or a short request is enough to get the relevant information (Tel. +39 0471 012100).
