Contract agreement and contract content. The Minimum Environmental Criteria (in Italian: Criteri Ambientali Minimi, CAM). Contract clauses and sustainable environmental and social contents.

Validity and invalidity of a contract. Unfair contract terms. Public procedures for the selection of contractors. Sustainability goals as a policy in contracts award criteria. The due diligence of the supply chain in the public sector and the related responsibility for the PA. General responsibility for non compliance with environmental and social legislation. Certifications for sustainability and their role in the public sector. Sustainability trademarks.

Performance and non performance of a public contract. Dispute resolution methods for public contracts' issues.
